


Key Vocabulary	
<b>documentary</b>	A film, radio or television programme that gives information about a particular subject or topic.
<b>frame</b>	One of the single still images that a film or video is made of.
<b>interview</b>	A meeting at which someone asks another person questions in order to find out their opinions.
<b>location</b>	A place outside a film studio where scenes of a film or television programme are made.
<b>pan</b>	When a camera moves left or right on a pivot but its base remains still.
<b>post-production</b>	The stage after <b>production</b> when filming is finished and the editing process begins.
<b>pre-production</b>	The planning stage that takes place before <b>production</b> .
<b>production</b>	The stage of filmmaking where the filming takes place.
<b>prop</b>	A small object used by actors during the performance of a play or in a film.
<b>shot</b>	A scene in a film that is filmed continuously by one camera.

### What Is Windows Movie Maker?

Windows Movie Maker is a free video editing program that allows users to create and enhance videos.

Users can integrate video, sound, still images and transcripts to create a movie.



### Different Filming Angles

**Low angle:** where the camera is below eye-level and points upwards toward the subject.

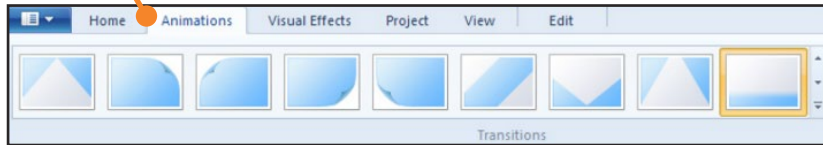
**High angle:** where the camera is higher than eye-level, shooting down from above.

**Side angles:** a **shot** from the side or behind.

**Bird's-eye view or worm's-eye view:** looking down from directly above or up from the ground.

### Transitioning Between Film Clips

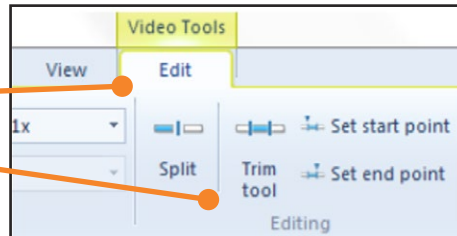
Select **Animations** from the toolbar.



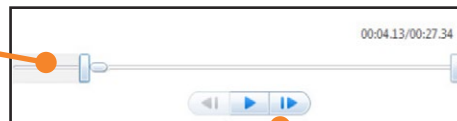
Choose an animation that will create a smooth visual opening or ending for each film clip.

### Trimming Video Clips

To trim any unwanted **frames** out of your film clips, click on **Edit** and then **Trim tool**.

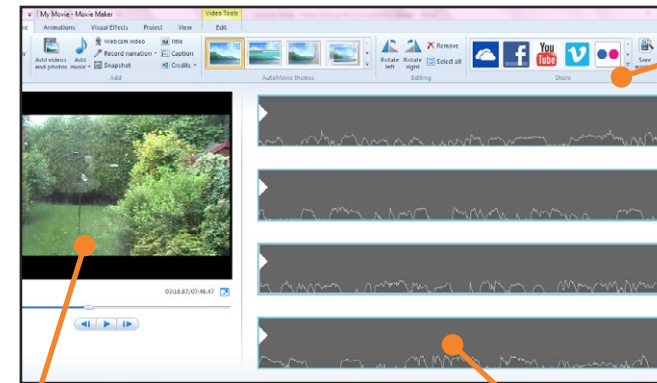


Use the sliders at each end to trim the video clip.



Click **Save Trim** when you are finished.

### Splitting Video Clips

You may want to insert an image or section of video into the middle of another film clip. To do this, you will need to split the clip first.

Select the point on the film clip where you want it to separate into two and click on **Split**.
