E-Safety

A Guide for Parents and Carers

Three Main Points

- ❑ Children today can be very 'tech savvy'
- ❑ Children do not necessarily have experience to judge risk
- ❑ The digital world can seem as important to children as the real world

Some food for thought...

'In a recent poll, when asked about their children's online activity, **85% of parents** of 10-14 year olds claim to know exactly what their children are doing.....

In the same poll, **85% of children** claim that their parents have no idea what they are up to!'

Childnet's SMART rules

Stay safe online

Remember the 5 SMART rules when using the internet and mobile phones.

S **SAFE**: Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information – such as your full name, email address, phone number, home address, photos or school name – to people you are chatting with online.

m **MEET**: Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present.

a **ACCEPTING**: Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems – they may contain viruses or nasty messages!

r **RELIABLE**: Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are. Make sure you check information before you believe it.

t **TELL**: Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.



Cyberbullying

- ❑ Can be done by anyone to anyone
- ❑ Occurs via text message, email, through social networking, blogging, ...
- ❑ Can be stopped



What can we do to help?

- Talk to your children and encourage them to talk to you about their internet use.
- Create a family agreement to establish boundaries.
- Use filtering software to block unwanted content.
- Encourage your child to 'think before you post'.
- Familiarise yourself with privacy settings and check these regularly
- If your child thinks they are being bullied online, tell them they must keep the evidence – don't delete.
- Have a family email address.

What can we do to help?

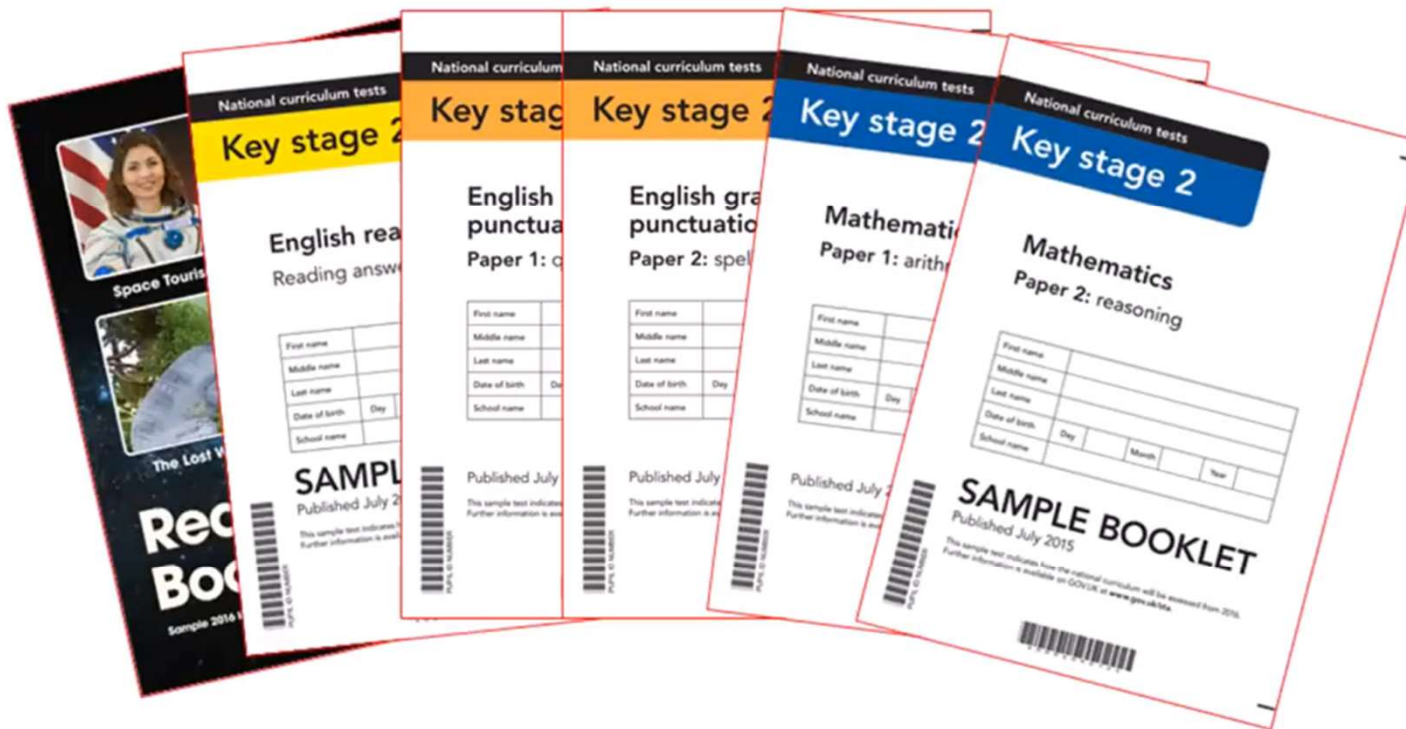
Familiarise yourself with age ratings for popular social media sites:

- ❑ Facebook, Snapchat, Twitter, WhatsApp, TikTok, Instagram and Skype ALL require users to be at least 13 years of age.
- ❑ Whilst there is no age restriction for watching videos on YouTube, users need to be 13 or older to have their own YouTube account.

Familiarise yourself with the age ratings of games your children are playing and films that they are watching

Key Stage 2 tests

English Tests

English is split into 3 different areas:

- Grammar and Punctuation
- Spelling
- Reading Comprehension

Grammar and Punctuation Test: Monday 12th May 2025

45 minute test (worth 50 marks)

- Knowledge of word classes
- Features of sentence types
- Phrases and clauses
- Standard English
- Tense structures
- Vocabulary
- Punctuation

Spelling Test: Monday 12th May

- Not timed (approx. 15 minutes)
- Worth 20 marks
- 20 spellings within distinct contextualised sentences
- Tests the range of spelling strategies children have been taught throughout KS2

English – Reading Test (Comprehension) Tuesday 13th May

- A total of 1 hour to read a text and complete the questions at their own pace (3 texts in total)
- Test carries 50 marks
- Children can refer back to the text
- Test focuses on several different types of text
- Reading for understanding is essential
- Children will be required to refer to text to justify their responses
- The texts become progressively harder

Mathematics Test Papers: Wed/Thursday 14th/15th May

There are three tests:

- **Paper 1 – Arithmetic: 30 minutes, 40 marks.** Testing basic arithmetic skills (sums!) using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, including decimals, percentages and fractions
- **Paper 2 – Maths reasoning: 40 minutes, 35 marks**
- **Paper 3 – Maths reasoning: 40 minutes, 35 marks**

Questions on paper 2 and 3 will test all areas covered in KS2 maths curriculum but now focus an application, reasoning and problem solving

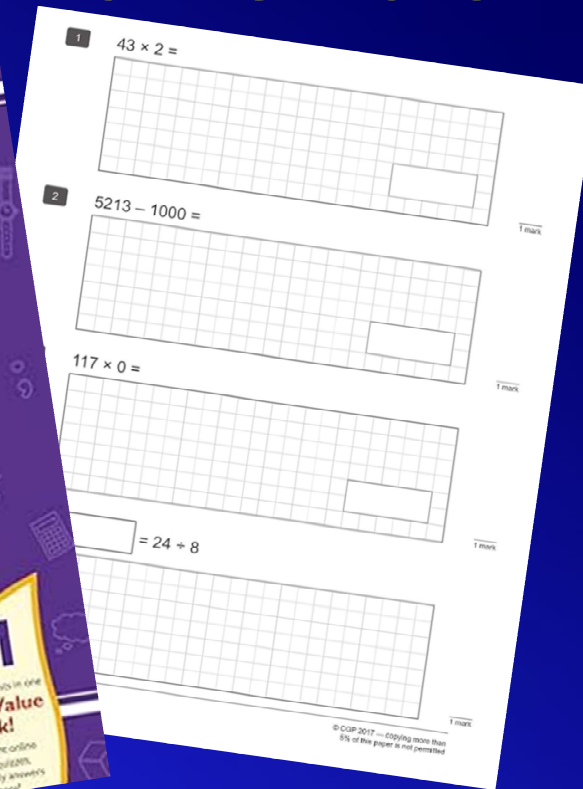
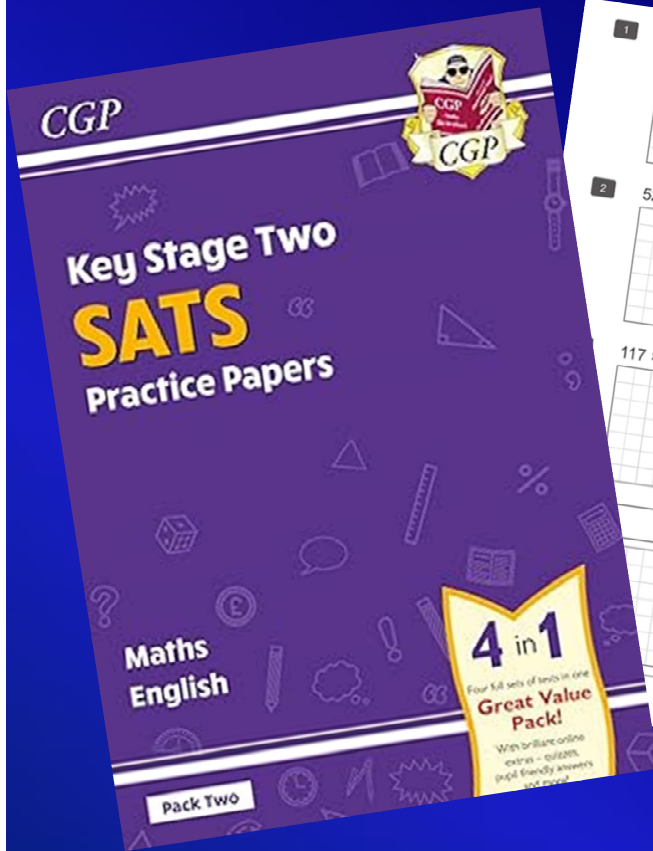
How we will help your child:

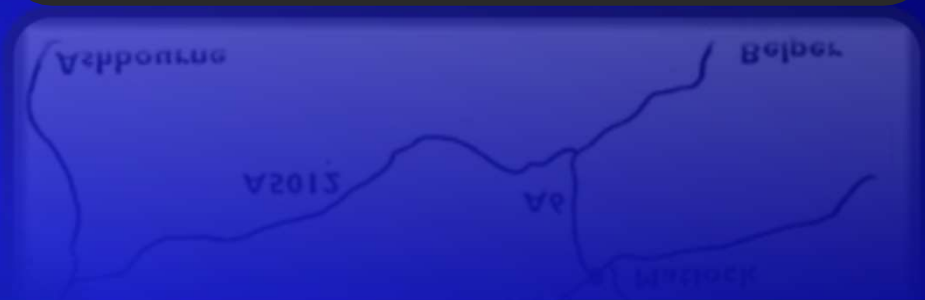
Duke's Barn
