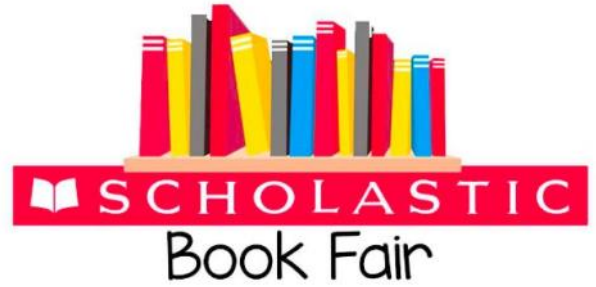
### EGYPTIAN WORKSHOP

Scarlett from 2B reached a new level of skill in climbing! Her family are very proud of all the hard work she's been putting in.

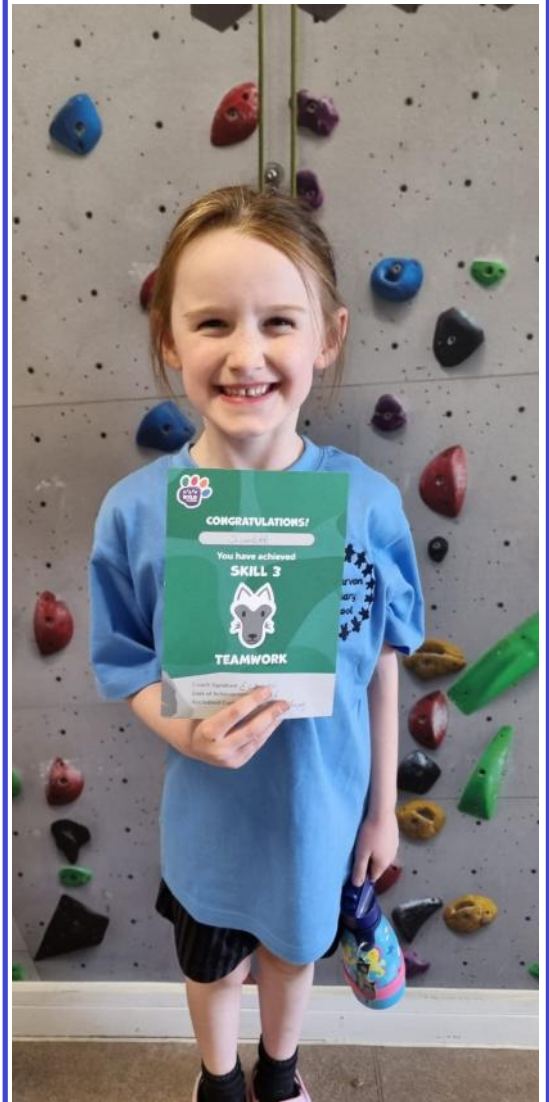

Ruben from 1CS completed a gymnastics competition on Monday and won a Silver Medal. His family are very proud. Well done Ruben!



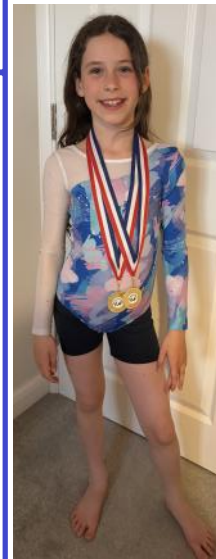
Lincoln from 1CS recently took part in a gymnastics competition in Bingham and won an award. His family are very proud of him.
