Children learn in small groups of up to five. Learning alongside friends helps children feel more relaxed, builds listening skills and keeps lessons social and enjoyable.

Some children may also receive one-to-one lessons where this supports their progress.

Lessons last 15 to 30 minutes, depending on group size. Longer individual lessons are available if needed.

Parents arrange for payment with them for their child's lessons, and complete an order with Normans Musical Instruments if they do not have an instrument already.

MUSIC FOR SCHOOLS FOUNDATION

Dear parent / guardian

Your school are providing children with the opportunity to learn a musical instrument in partnership with the **Music for Schools Foundation**, a non-profit making charity that provide small group lessons on Recorder, Clarinet, Flute, Trumpet, Cornet and Saxophone.

Today your child was involved in a special assembly where we taught them all about music and instruments.

Why should my child learn to play an instrument?

Our amazing tutors make lessons fun, and children who learn to play a musical instrument also perform better in Maths, English and Science. There are social, emotional and developmental benefits too, such as improved memory, patience, perseverance and self-confidence.

How much does it cost?

Your child can learn to play for around **£1.50 per day** and packages include an instrument, music book, music stand, book bag and instrument maintenance cover. If you already have an instrument you can just pay for lessons and there are also reductions for children eligible for Pupil Premium.

To enrol for lessons:

Lessons will be starting soon - enrol within the next seven days to ensure that your child doesn't miss out!

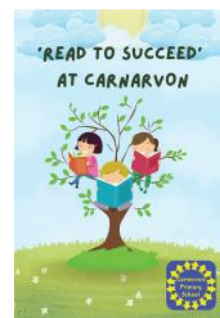
READ TO SUCCEED
