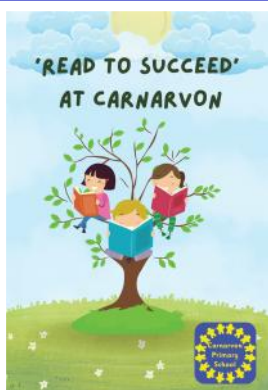

YEAR 4 FOREST SCHOOL

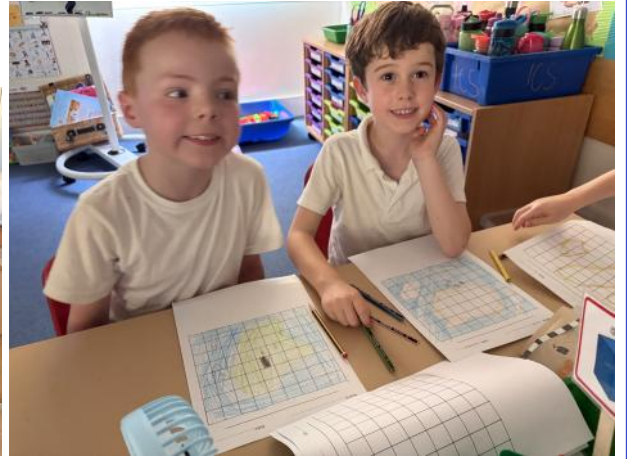

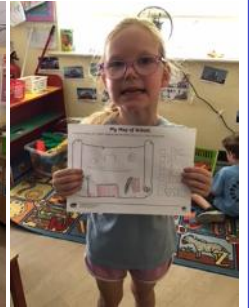
GEOGRAPHY DAY

Becoming a member

Learning: As an Recognised RYA (Royal Yachting Association) Training Centre we offer accredited training at all levels in dinghy sailing, windsurfing, wingsurfing and powerboating. We also run RYA First Aid Courses.



RYA Courses

- **Dinghy Sailing:** There are RYA Dinghy courses for adults up to intermediate level.
- **Youth Sailing:** Join our junior **Saturday Club** and as they progress onto **RYA courses**, young people can start racing and join our **Youth Race Squad**. A number of our inspirational young members have gone on to National squads in both sailing and windsurfing.
- **Sailability:** For those sailors with additional requirements we have adapted boats ideal for those with limited mobility or needing additional support.
- **Powerboating:** We encourage you to take the free club safety duty course (powerboat) to enable you to drive the safety boats. (See powerboat courses via QR code). Alternatively sign up for an RYA Powerboat Level 2 course.
- **Windsurfing and Wingsurfing:** we offer courses to intermediate level.



Use club boats

After learning you can:

- **Use Club Boats:** for those yet to take the plunge and buy a boat, we loan boats to members with appropriate training and experience. There is a display in the training room explaining the clubs boats.
- **Join one of our supported Club Fleets:** Our friendly fleet captains can often provide the chance to sail with an experienced helm in classes like the Scorpion, RS400 or Flying Fifteen. Crewing with an experienced helm can really bring on your sailing and also allows you to experience racing without having to commit to a boat purchase. There is also a strong Menagerie fleet.
- **Informal race training,** is available for adult dinghy sailors.
- **Casual Sailing:** you can buy an inexpensive dinghy to start racing or just cruise when the water is quieter.
- **Racing:** There is racing Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday, aimed at all levels.
- **Wind and Wing surfing:** We have racing for Windsurfing. In addition many members casual sail on Wings, Foils, Windsurfers. Wednesday pm see many windsurfers enjoying the water.

More activities at Notts County:

Instructing: As you improve you may want to put something back into the sport. You can help and work towards becoming an Assistant Instructor or progress further to Dinghy, Powerboat or Windsurf / Wing instructor (over 16 only). Please contact principal@ncsc.org.uk in the first instance to discuss.

SUP (Stand Up Paddleboard): is another option for members both on the large and small lake.

Lifeguarded open water swimming: is available with our affiliated group (Love Open Water). Members receive reduced fees. Swimming at any other times is not permitted.

Social events: we have a number of club socials throughout the year for members. Camping for members is permitted at most of these events.

Facilities

The club is based on a large and smaller lake, with three slipways and a large grassed area. Water use is permitted any day between 2nd Feb and 30th Sept, with restrictions over the winter months.

We have a large clubroom along with changing, training facilities, a bar and catering.

The Club is run entirely by volunteers and everyone is expected to support the club to run smoothly.
