Well done to all of you!

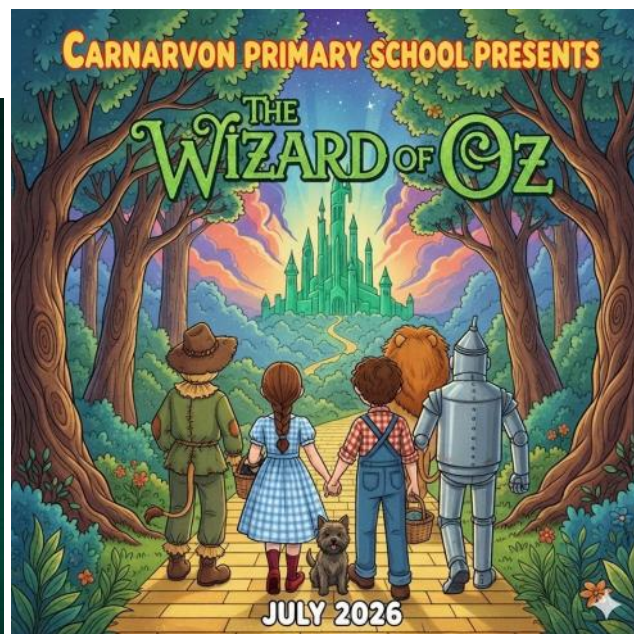


YEAR 5 & 6 SHOW

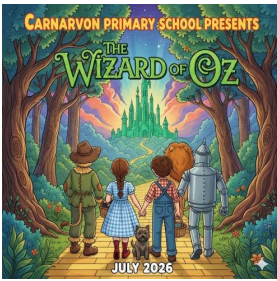
Well, what a show we've had this year!! Mr Lloyd did a fantastic job, supported by his team. We received many positive comments from parents, so thank you for letting us know.

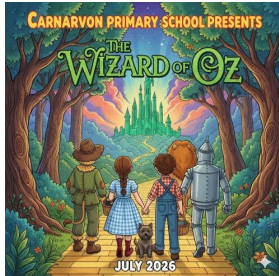
